Project Schedule: Design and utility relocation is expected to complete in 2024. Construction is expected to be completed in the following three years (2027).

Issues To Be Addressed: Safety, mobility, shared-use path/roadway and bridge improvements.

Project Description

The D B Wood Road Phase 2 project is part of the City of Georgetown – Mobility Bond 2021 that addresses current and future growth to maintain a high level of safety, mobility, and quality of life for residents and communities.

The project will upgrade the existing two-lane undivided roadway by widening and reconstructing D B Wood Road to a four-lane, divided, major arterial roadway with left and right turn lanes as needed and a combination of storm sewer and open-ditch drainage.

The project also includes a shareduse path for pedestrians and bicycles on one side along with widening the existing bridge that crosses over the San Gabriel River.

The project design began in 2022 and is expected to be completed by early 2024, and construction is expected to be completed in 2027.

Project Need


Williamson County and the City of Georgetown have experienced significant growth in recent years, and current population projections predict that this trend will continue. The City of Georgetown is ranked as one of the top 10 fastest-growing cities by the U.S. Census Bureau and has experienced a population growth of 67.94% in the last 10 years*.

Since 2015, Georgetown has been included in the list of the top 10 fastest-growing cities and topped the list in 2016 and 2022. For the second year in a row, Georgetown is the fastest-growing city in the U.S. for cities with a population above 50,000, according to data released [May 18, 2023] by the U.S. Census Bureau. Georgetown's growth rate was 14.4 percent from July 1, 2021, through July 1, 2022, resulting in a population estimate of 86,507*.

The D B Wood Road Phase 2 widening and reconstruction project will help meet the needs of motorists in one of the fastest-growing areas of the county.
