



PROPOSITION B: Recreation Center Renovation and Expansion

City of Georgetown 2023 Bond Election

The City of Georgetown has called a Nov. 7 election for a bond package that would fund new and expanded customer service, animal sheltering, and recreation facilities. Voters will see four separate propositions on the ballot.

No Expected Change to the City's Tax Rate

All proposed projects are expected to be funded within the City's current tax rate.

Proposition B: Recreation Center Renovation and Expansion (\$49 million)

Proposition B would fund a complete renovation of the existing 65,000-square-foot facility and a 30,000-square-foot expansion of the Georgetown Recreation Center. Built in 1995 and last expanded in 2009, the current facility was not designed to serve the number of people using it today. Budget includes cost of design, construction, inflation, equipment, fixtures and furnishings.





More health, fitness and recreational opportunities for all ages

The proposed renovation and expansion would add a third gym and more multi-purpose spaces so that youth sports leagues and summer camps can serve more families, without displacing seniors and other users not engaging in organized programming.

The project would include:

- Event hall, game room and library for seniors
- Dedicated spaces for teens
- Larger childcare center
- Covered outdoor fitness area
- More fitness studios
- Renovations to the indoor lap pool to enable more recreational uses
- Indoor playground
- Complete renovation to existing space including new carpet, paint and lighting.
